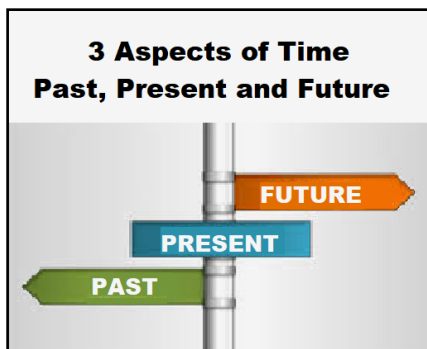


Mary's School of Prophecy

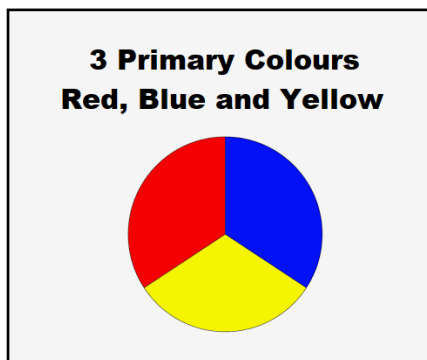
If the Father and Son are Male, is the Holy Spirit Female?

We're talking about the nature of the universe which is in triplicate and I'd like to say that God signed His masterpiece in triplicate, in other words the universe is like an artist painting a painting and he signs his name at the bottom and then that's how you know who painted the painting. Well God signed His name on the universe in triplicate, because He is the great three persons in one. It's one of the proofs of the universe, and in my last program, I went through some of the many trinities. I didn't do all of them. We're going to have to do another program because there are three different kinds of trinities. Maybe we can get into that.

So I'm just going to review quickly what is meant by it, and we discovered that the structural trinities, that's what these first ones are that I'm talking about, they reflect the three persons of the Trinity, in other words you can tell which is which. For example, time. Time is as past, present and future, and past is God the Father.

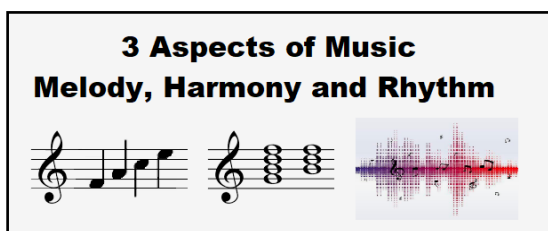


That's because we know it. We know that there's no mystery about it. It's unchangeable. It's rock solid like the father in a family. The past represents God the Father. The present is active. It's vital. It's moving. That represents God the Son, just like a son in a family. The future is mysterious and I don't know if it's feminine or not, but women are mysterious. That's a feminine characteristic, and that reflects the Holy Spirit.

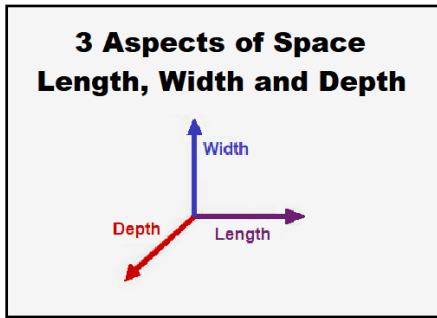


And I went through the primary colours, and we had a little controversy on this. I think everyone understands that red would be Jesus, because of the blood and I've always said that blue is the Father because it's cool, calm and collected, and yellow would be the Holy Spirit. And Kathleen says, "No, blue that's like for Mary, the spouse of the Holy Spirit and so the blue would be the Holy Spirit", and she said, "Yellow is gold". That would be God the Father, so I'm going to have to think about that one. I'm not giving in on my own

position yet, but it shows that there are obviously different ways to look at it,

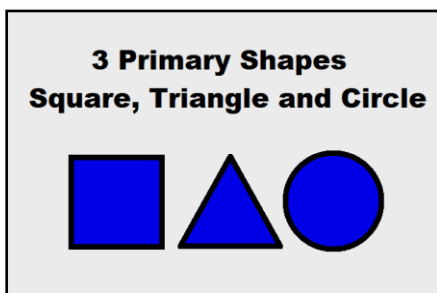


Did we go through music? Melody, harmony and rhythm; God the Father would be the melody. God the Son reflects the melody, or works with the God the Father; that would be the harmony, Jesus, and the rhythm moves things along. That would be the Holy Spirit.



Length, width and depth are the three dimensions of space. Space is comprised of three dimensions, because it reflects the Divine Trinity. Length would be left to right, like the horizon, horizontal. Width or up and down, vertical, that's the second dimension. Every point has three dimensions, left to right, up and down and where's the third dimension? Well you can't see the third dimension because it's directly through the centre

of those points, in other words it's invisible. It's there but it's invisible, and that shows that the depth, that is front to back, would be the Holy Spirit. The left to right, the length would be God the Father because it represents stability. Up and down would be God the Son because it represents activity or vitality.



And we did the three primary shapes. I might as well go over them. The square; and we had some controversy on that. Every shape in the universe can be built out of these three shapes, the square, the triangle or the circle. I say that a square is the most stable. It represents God the Father. The triangle would be God the Son. The circle is mysterious. That would be God the Holy Spirit, and some of you pointed out that the triangle has

the most strength with steel; steel engineering, and that's true and as far as the structure goes. And of course I haven't mentioned the Geodesic Dome by Bucky Fuller, but as far as masonry goes, certainly the square is the strongest shape. In any case, those are the three shapes, and this is also a good example of a Holy Spirit Trinity.

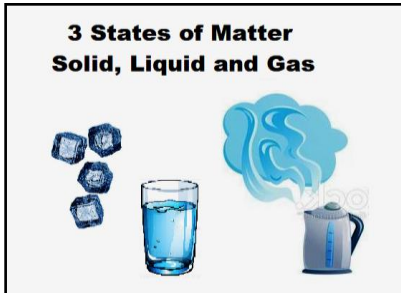
The Holy Spirit Trinity is 2 + 1. Two are similar, one is different, and many of these structural trinities, which show the structure of the universe; many of them are also Holy Spirit trinities. A characteristic of the Holy Spirit trinity is that two are similar; in this case they have straight sides. They have acute angles, and the third is different. That's a Holy Spirit type trinity, so this is also a good example of a Holy Spirit trinity. Even though many characteristics of a woman represent the Holy Spirit, the Holy Spirit actually has to do with reproduction, and I mentioned the private parts of a male for example are 2 + 1. Two are similar, one is different, and we wouldn't say that they're feminine, but actually they represent the Holy Spirit, and actually the female reproductive organs are also 2 + 1.



Okay we went over the sun, moon and stars and actually this is a Holy Spirit trinity as well as a structural trinity. The sun would be God the Father. The moon reflects the sun. It also changes. Every night it changes its appearance, and the stars would be the difference. Two are similar; same shape. They both give light. The stars are quite a bit different, so this is also a Holy Spirit trinity.



The Divine Trinity is of course the Father, Son and the Spirit, and I said that if you want to figure out any of these, you look at it, in my opinion, that God the Father would represent stability, strength. God the Son is activity, vitality and the Holy Spirit is mystery, which is a more feminine characteristic.



And the three states of matter are solid, liquid and gas. Everything in the universe is a solid, a liquid or a gas. This is how God signed His name on the universe in trinity, so that we can understand Him better. The solid would be God the Father. Liquid; movement, activity, vitality; that's God the Son, and the gas would be mysterious, the Holy Spirit.

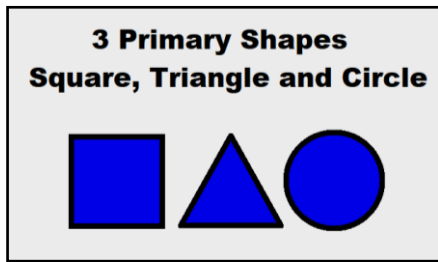
The trinities that have to do with God the Father are the structural trinities. The trinities that have to do with God the Son are the gradation trinities and the trinities that have to do with the Holy Spirit are called the reproduction trinities or the 2 + 1 trinities. Now the gradation trinities are like small, medium and large. That would be the gradation trinities and the feminine size would be small; medium would be Jesus and large would be God the Father, and we see that in the family. The woman is always in general, the smallest of the three. Well actually the son would go from the middle area, starting out as a baby growing into an adult. There's change there. That represents the gradation trinities.

There are all different kinds of gradations. I mean you get smooth to rough. The smooth would be feminine, the Holy Spirit. The rough would be God the Father. The Son is in that middle range, going from smooth to rough. The same way with loud to quiet; quiet with the feminine, the loud is masculine. The Son represents the middle range, and there are many of those.

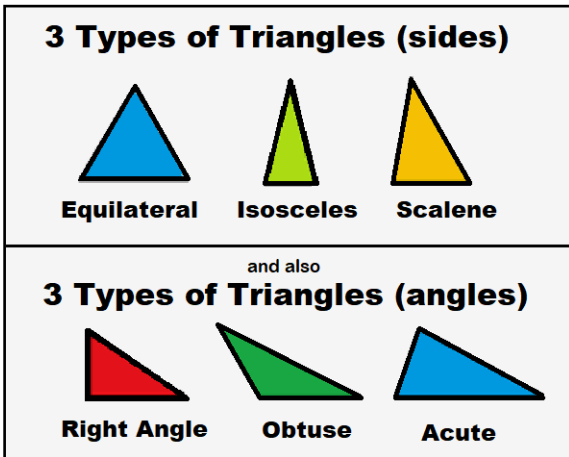
Then I gave the question, so what about the knife, fork and spoon, which does not have anything to do with the universe. God did not design the knife, fork or spoon or did He? Certainly the knife, fork and spoon is an interesting trinity and I don't know if anybody gave me the answer for that or not, and the other trinity would be of the human being, which is made up of body, mind and spirit, and I think that's a pretty simple one. Very often if you try to figure out these trinities, you look at the easiest one. So body, mind and spirit; obviously the Holy Spirit would represent the spirit of a man, but the body and the mind? In my opinion, the body would be God the Father and the mind would be God the Son, but if you have some other opinion, I'd be glad to hear it.

And as far as knife, fork and spoon goes, does anybody have any idea for a knife, fork and spoon? I would say the knife would be masculine. That would be God the Father. The spoon is a feminine shape. That would be feminine, and the fork is the most active of all three utensils, and that would be God the Son, just in case you want to pursue this in a social context and you want to bring up a conversation that other people might be interested in, although probably at most cocktail parties,

they're not going to want to discuss the Divine Trinity, but maybe in your church group, you may have a discussion in your church group.

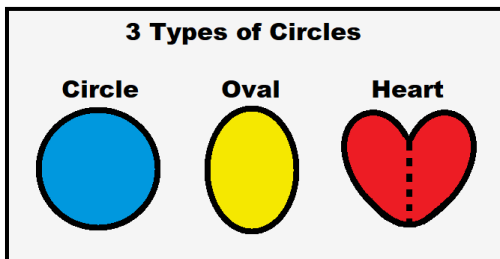


These are the three primary shapes in the universe. All structure is built around these three shapes. Each of these has three different shapes. There are three different types of triangles, three different types of circles, three different types of squares and they also represent the Divine Trinity.



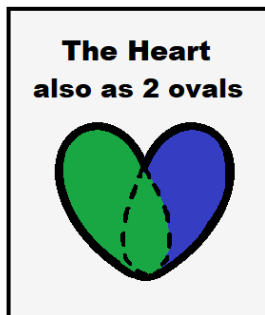
The three types of triangles; this would be equilateral. That's one type of triangle, and there is the isosceles where two sides are the same and one side is different. That would also be a Holy Spirit triangle, and then you have all three sides different, each leg of the triangle has a different length. So, can you guess which it would be? I say that the triangle with the three equal sides would represent God the Father; stability. And as I mentioned, the two sides equal and one different; that would

be the Holy Spirit. The three sides all different lengths or I think it's called a scalene triangle; that would be God the Son. That would represent activity, the difference. It's like the moon changing into a different phase every night.



What are the three circles? This is kind of trickier. Okay there are the three types of circles. There's your regular circle. There's your oval. That's if you hold a circle at an angle, you get an oval. So it's a circle from a different perspective. And you might ask, "How is a heart a circle?" Well a heart is a

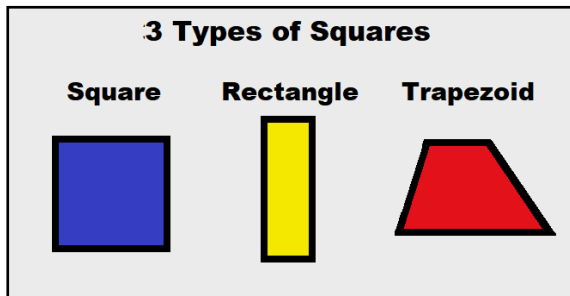
circle bent in half, and I'll put a dotted line to show you where you bend it. Now the circle of the three geometric shapes, the three structural shapes, represent the feminine of the circle, square and triangle, but in this case because it is the most irregular of the three shapes, it would be God the Father. The oval being even the more feminine shape would be the Holy Spirit and the heart



would be God the Son. In fact when a priest breaks the host at the consecration, it looks like this (a heart) before he breaks it apart, and the broken host of course represents broken Jesus



and that's the shape of the heart. So that's those three shapes.



Let's do the square, which is also simple. So there are our three types of squares, and of course the most regular one would be God the Father, and the rectangle would be the Holy Spirit. The four sides of different lengths is called a trapezoid and that would be God the Son, so each of those structural trinities is very interesting.

There are many other gradation trinities which represent God the Son. There are a few more 2 + 1 trinities or reproductive trinities which represent the Holy Spirit and there are more structural trinities which represent God the Father, so I think I've gone over a lot of them if you read my book, volume 1 on pages to 92 - 95. I was hoping somebody would read that and you can correct me, and mention some of the other trinities which I have not covered.

In conclusion, (in answer to the title of this video, "If the Father and Son is Male, is the Holy Spirit female?") one reason why you can't say the Holy Spirit is feminine is because the Holy Spirit overshadows Mary to conceive Jesus so the Holy Spirit is masculine.
